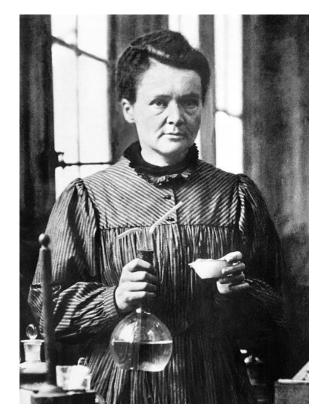

# **MSCA Special Needs allowance**

- Why? A new allowance to support MSCA fellows with longterm physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments, whose participation in MSCA would not be possible without extra financial support.
- What? It covers additional costs that MSCA researchers/staff members with a disability face due to the increased costs of their mobility during the main ITN, IF, RISE or COFUND action.
  - ✓ assistance by third persons
  - ✓ adaptation of work environment
  - ✓ additional travel/transportation costs
- What not? It cannot fund costs which are already covered by another source (e.g. social security or health insurance).
- How much? A maximum of EUR 60 000 per researcher/staff member (total budget for 2019: EUR 1 000 000).
- How? Individual-based proposals can be submitted by MSCA beneficiaries. Next deadline: autumn 2019.

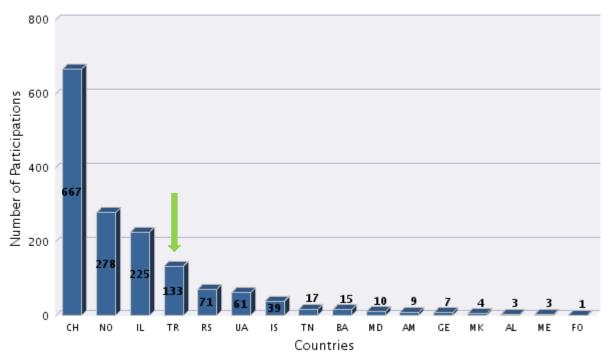


# **Turkey and the MSCA**

74 Turkish organisations participating (in total 133 participations) MSCA budget awarded to Turkish organisations: € 21 Mio

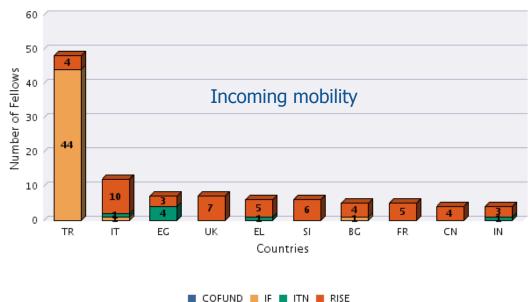
#### Number of participations of AC organisations



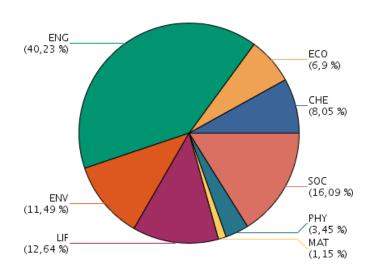


## **Mobility patterns**

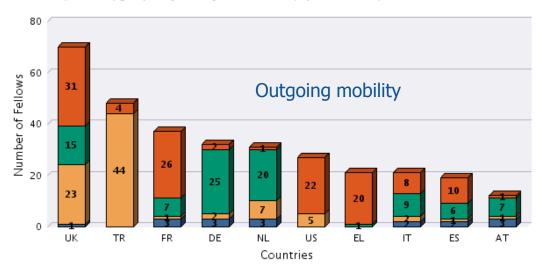
Fellows going to TR, grouped by their nationality (top 10 nationalities)

# **MSCA** in Horizon Europe

- Overall: continuation
- Investing in the people behind R&I, delivering talents and improving careers
- Bottom-up, competition-based research programme
- Creating impact on researchers, institutions, systems
- 5 areas of intervention:
  - mobility of researchers
  - training of researchers
  - strengthening human capital across the ERA
  - facilitating synergies
  - promoting public outreach





# MSCA in Horizon Europe, guiding principles

- Researcher-centred, new skills and knowledge
- Charter and Code principles
- Triple I cross-boundary collaboration and mobility:
  - International
  - Inter-sectoral (incl research-business)
  - Interdisciplinary
- Open to all domains, relevance for society (SDGs)
- Responsible Research & Innovation
  - Equal opportunities
  - Open Science and FAIR data
- Principles of equality, diversity and inclusion

# **Evolution in the implementation**

- Streamlined actions. From 9 sub-actions to 5 actions
- Continuation of simplified form of grants
- Simpler rules, fine-tuned definitions, harmonised conditions
- Demand management
- Improved internal coherence & reinforced external synergies





#### 1. MSCA Doctorates

- MSCA will continue to support doctoral candidates and programmes
- Integrating objectives of 3 sub-actions into a single action
  - Incentives for industrial or joint doctorates
  - Pre-agreement for joint degrees required
- Manage demand, improve success rates
  - Reduce #fellow-months/project restrict resubmissions below quality threshold





#### 2. MSCA Postdocs

- Continue supporting post-doctoral researchers
- Focus on the scientifically younger generation
  - Scientific age: # years of experience in research after obtaining PhD degree
  - Emphasis on new and early career researchers (legal base, recital 9)
  - Structuring effects, avoiding 'permadocs'
- Clarify and simplify. From 5 sub-actions to 1 single action
- Deliver highly-skilled talents to both academia and beyond
  - Supervision & career development
  - Collaboration & exposure beyond academia





# 3. MSCA Exchanges

- Continue supporting staff exchanges, open to any type of staff
- Emphasis on the added-value of the collaboration itself
- Lean and flexible tool to support collaboration
- I³ approach, incl. academia-to-academia exchanges within Europe





## 4. MSCA Synergies

- Continue co-funding national, regional, institutional schemes for doctoral training and postdoctoral fellowships
- Introduce sustainable structuring effects, spread best practice
- Simplification: **increase in total EU contribution** up to the minimum amount required to pay the fellow. No mandatory top-up.
- Greater focus on new beneficiaries and new training programmes





### 5. MSCA Festivals

- Continuation of the European Researchers' Night-like activities
- Extension to existing outreach events
  - Supporting also other science festivals and outreach events with EU-added value





# Managing the demand

- Highly attractive programme, systematically oversubscribed
  - Success rates decrease (7% for ITN in 2017)
  - Number of applications increase (>9,800 for IF in 2018)
  - Resubmissions
- Consequently:
  - Increasing number of top quality applications remain unfunded (ITN, IF)
  - Increasing complexity to manage the proposal evaluation (IF)
- Designing measures to better manage the demand





## **Sharing excellence**

- Maintain competition-for-excellence principle
- Contribute to strengthening the ERA
  - Widening Fellowships pilot 2018-2020 (to be evaluated in 2020/2021)
  - Seal of Excellence
  - Increase the funding per fellow in the new MSC Synergies Action
  - Network of MSCA NCPs / NCP Academy





## Internal coherence and external synergies

#### Synergies with other parts of Horizon Europe

- Linking with global challenges (missions, partnerships) and open innovation (EIT-KICs). Clustering.
- Facilitating access to innovation/entrepreneurial activities. Training.
- Strengthening the ERA

#### Synergies with other EU programmes

- Structural Funds
- Education policies. Teaching. European Universities.

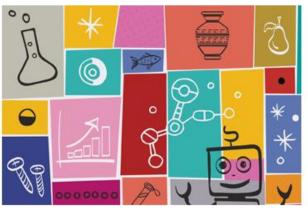
