Round Table Discussions 1

Career Development, Sustainable Research, and Innovation: Bridging Pathways for Gen Z through the MCAA Lens

- This roundtable convenes educators, researchers, and industry leaders to reimagine career development through the integration of sustainable research practices, Al-enhanced learning, and inclusive innovation-drawing insights from Marie Sklodowska-Curie Alumni Association (MCAA) expertise.
- Focusing on the intersection of work-integrated learning (WIL), responsible research, and digital innovation, we will examine emerging frameworks that empower Gen Z through personalized, Al-enhanced support systems, ethical mentorship, and transdisciplinary mobility.
- Core discussion themes include: (1) integrating sustainability literacy and green skills into research training and innovation ecosystems; (2) rethinking career pathways with a focus on equity, just transitions, and global mobility; and (3) discussing best practices from MSCA-funded initiatives that model adaptable, cross-sector, and scalable approaches to career development.
- Through interactive dialogue, the session will foster cross-disciplinary exchange on building ethical, adaptable, and sustainability-oriented ecosystems that equip the next generation not only for employment, but for meaningful, purposedriven contribution in society. Attendees will gain actionable strategies to bridge education, research, and industry fora more resilient and inclusive future of work.





Round Table Discussions 2

Beyond Bullet Points: Reframing Sustainable Career Development through Narrative CVs and Peer Mentorship for Gen Z

- This roundtable invites participants to reimagine career development by embracing narrative CVs, peer mentorship, and sustainability-aligned research practices, drawing on the values of the Marie Curie Alumni Association (MCAA) and the **PEP-CV** community.
- We will explore how personalized, story-driven approaches can empower early-career researchers to articulate not only achievements, but also challenges, transitions, and growth.
- Key themes include: (1) the role of digital tools in supporting the co-creation of narrative CVs and reflective career planning; (2) integrating sustainability literacy and just transition values into research training and innovation; and (3) fostering meaningful peer mentoring models that build community, promote inclusion, and value diverse career paths.
- Participants will share insights and co-develop strategies for building a future-facing, ethical, and inclusive research culture-one that values both the professional and the personal journey.
- This session serves as a space to inspire, connect, and support the next generation of researchers in telling their stories and shaping a more sustainable future.
